## Volunteer Community Health Coach Program

Attention Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors

We are now accepting applications for the Volunteer Community Health Coach Program. This internship will count as a four credit course during the Spring of 2017 and is open to students of any major. Accepted students will complete three weeks of training at the Jefferson Regional Medical Center during intercession where they will learn about chronic diseases, biological, psychological, and social determinants of health, as well as the business side of healthcare. Furthermore, students will have the opportunity to shadow various healthcare professionals, including nurse practitioners, physicians, and physician assistants. Following training, each health coach will be assigned a patient with whom he or she will conduct weekly visits at the patient's home, with the main goal of keeping the patient out of the hospital.
